Hobbs Park History:

Quonset at Hobbs Park First East Lawrence Rec Center

LBJ's message to Congress on March 16, 1964 was to declare "unconditional war" on poverty.

One way in which that war was to be fought was by the creation of the Office of Economic Opportunity. The OEO was created by R. Sargent Shriver who served as the first director from 1965 to 1968. In 1969 Donald Rumsfeld was tapped by Pres. Nixon to run the OEO regarded by the new admiration as symbolic of 1960s liberalism. Upon learning that staff referred to clients as "low-income individuals," Rumsfeld issued a memorandum in which he said OEO personnel should use the words "which are as specific and accurate as possible." Describing the use of poor as "accurate and entirely appropriate," the 24 million Americans were to be called what they were: Poor.

School begins at 8:00am and dismisses at 3:00pm. On Wednesdays, school dismisses at 1:30pm. New York Elementary's PTO meets every third Tuesday at 5:30pm. New York Elementary's Site Council meets on the first Tuesday of each month at 5:30pm. For a USD 497 calendar, including conference dates and no school notices, visit www.usd497.org.

Health Clinic in Our Neighborhood

Heartland Community Health Center (HCHC) is a holistic, primary care health clinic that serves low-income community members. HCHC offers a place where individuals and families can receive care and build healthy relationships regardless of ability to pay. Heartland Community Health Center is a safe, welcoming environment for all patients.

At HCHC, we believe in a model of health care that includes the emotional, nutritional, spiritual, and social aspects of an individual's health. At HCHC, we desire to not only treat current symptoms but to provide any support, or care that our patients may need to prevent sickness before it begins.

As a federally funded community health center, HCHC receives funding through three main avenues: grants, private support, and patient fees/insurance reimbursement. Heartland Community Health Center accepts patients who are uninsured, publicly insured, or who have commercial insurance. Patients who do not have any coverage will pay a fee based upon a sliding fee scale.


By the summer of 1968 the East Lawrence neighborhood was on the front lines of LBJ's war. The poor folk of the bottoms were the targeted with an \$8,267 12-month grant from the Office of Economic Opportunity's Community Action Program (CAP) to organize a multipurpose community action service center. It was to be housed in a Quonset hut on the southeast corner of 10th & Delaware St. Tutoring was one of many services offered at the action service center.

The City had neglected to participate in a spring meeting called by the Community Resources Board to meet with OEO officials to discuss expanded anti-poverty efforts for Lawrence but by summer had graciously offered the use of a facility, the recently abandoned garage for garbage trucks.

The ground of the first East Lawrence Recreation Center was once part the abolitionist publisher John Speer's farmstead; selling a portion for \$1,400, to the Society of Friends on July 29, 1871. The Quakers erected a yearly meeting house in 1872, razing it in 1941 and selling the 350'x 250' tract to Kenneth Bailey on Dec. 20, 1943. The city council approved the purchase of the land on July 8, 1946 from Bailey for \$1,900.

The center was demolished in the makeover of the old Municipal Baseball Park in 1980, which was made possible by Myra B. Hobbs' bequest. The current East Lawrence Recreation Center at 1245 E. 15th Street opened in 1979.
