

From the President

I am grateful to have served as ELNA President, grateful to work with an awesome ELNA board, volunteers and neighborhood coordinator, and grateful to have three dynamic people to put their names forward to serve as new board members.

I am grateful for all of you who show up in your lives every day and do what needs to be done, and still manage to share a little bit extra. Wishing you all a wonderful Thanksgiving holiday. And watch out 2026. We're coming for you!

Adopt a Family for the Holidays

Again this year, ELNA will adopt a family for the holidays, this time through the Holiday Bureau.

How it works:

The Holiday Bureau, housed at the Ballard Center in North Lawrence, accepts applications from families they serve in early November. By the end of November the application closes and they begin to match families with organizations and groups who have indicated interest in adopting a family.

The Holiday Bureau then shares details with us about the family assigned to us. We usually ask to adopt one large family, with many children, as they are often most difficult to match. They give us a few details about our family like age, gender, clothing and shoe size, and a few items they might each like to receive as gifts. For example, they might tell us there is a boy in our family who is six years old, wears a youth medium in shirts, size 7 pants, children's shoe size 12, likes Pokemon and wants comics and art supplies for Christmas. We will receive this kind of information for all members of the family.

City Commission and School Elections are Underway!

It is local election season in Kansas. On our ballot, four candidates will vie for two seats on the Lawrence City Commission. The candidates are Mike Courtney, Bart Littlejohn, Kristine Polian and Bob Schumm. Seven candidates compete for three seats on the USD 497 School Board. They are Bob Byers, ChrisTopher Enneking, Kelly Jones, Shannon Kimball, Matt Lancaster, Pam Shaw and Molly Starr.


Remember these dates and details: Advance voting in person and by mail began on October 15. You can advance vote in person until noon on Monday, November 3 at the Douglas County Elections Office in the Malls Shopping Center at 711 W 23rd Street (23rd & Louisiana). The closest drop boxes for mail in ballots are located at the County Courthouse at 11th & Mass., the Elections Office at 23rd & Louisiana, and the Treasurer's Office at 2610 W. 6th Street. Election Day is Tuesday, November 4. Voting locations are the Cider Gallery at 810 Pennsylvania Street (If you live north of Eleventh Street) or Trinity Lutheran Church at 1245 New Hampshire Street (if you live between Eleventh and Fifteenth Streets).

City of Lawrence Safe Winter Walkways

Preparing snow routes for pedestrian traffic

The Safe Winter Walkways Program is an excellent resource for members of our community who are physically unable to keep their sidewalks clear during snow events. The goal is to create safer and more accessible pedestrian walkways, and it is a structured version of what already happens in many neighborhoods – neighbors helping neighbors. Volunteers are matched with residents needing assistance, and the program makes every effort to match volunteers with residents in their neighborhoods. All volunteers are asked to commit to the entire snow season and be willing to shovel after each winter weather event. Volunteers are not required to provide snow removal for private driveways, sidewalks or walkways, but they may choose to also clear those areas.

November 21, 2025 is the deadline for registering for assistance with Safe Winter Walkways. Please direct questions to Larry Woydziak at the Senior Resource Center for Douglas County, (785) 727-7875.

The Safe Winter Walkways is a program provided by the City of Lawrence and the Senior Resource Center for Douglas County.

To volunteer to help Lawrence residents who can't physically shovel their sidewalks, fill out and submit this volunteer sign up form: <https://lawrence.wufoo.com/forms/w7p2m1/> or call (785) 727-7875. Volunteers are asked to commit to the snow season and shovel snow each snow fall. Snow removal is limited to public sidewalks and a walkway to the street from the front door. This does not include driveways, porches or other walkways. Volunteers may choose to clear these areas but it is not an expectation of the program.





ELNA Monthly Meetings to Return to New York School in 2026

The East Lawrence Neighborhood Association will be returning to our roots in 2026. Starting with our January 12, 2026 Meeting, ELNA's meetings will be held at New York School, 936 New York Street.

In late September, ELNA was informed by Lawrence Parks and Rec that we were uninvited from holding our monthly meetings at the Santa Fe (Amtrak) Depot at Seventh & New Jersey. Building locks were changed and we were told that "the Santa Fe Depot will fully transition to internal City use and will no longer be available to host meetings or events for external groups."

Over the several decades of our existence, the neighborhood association has most often met at our neighborhood school. That changed with Covid, when the schools were closed, and ELNA meetings went online via Zoom. After things reopened, the school was no longer available due to USD 497's stated budget constraints, so we moved our meetings to the Depot, hybrid style.

ELNA is grateful to the New York Montessori PTA which has agreed to sponsor our return to the school. For those rare times when the school might be unavailable, we have secured an alternative meeting space in a commercial business at Ninth and New York.

Adopt a Family, continued

As an organization, ELNA then shares family details with neighbors who want to participate in the project. We'll collect a suit of clothes and presents for each family member and a grocery gift card for the family's holiday meal. Sometimes, neighbors want to contribute just cash or check and Lane will do the shopping. :)

Then we have a party! We get all the gifts we've collected together and wrap them. Aaron usually makes some chili and people bring snacks and drinks to share. You're invited! Even if you don't contribute an item to the family. Come help us wrap!

AND THEN Lane can get any last minute gifts or gift cards and deliver the whole carload to the drop off location to be given to the family. Usually, the gifts have to be ready for the family by the second week of December.
